What's this program about?

Earn Social Science (ISS) and/or Political Science credit while studying British politics, society, and culture in two of the great cities of the United Kingdom. London is one of the world's great political centers, the birthplace of representative democracy and the busy heart of a major European parliamentary system. It is also a lively center of Western culture and entertainment. Students will have access to some of the world's greatest museums and historic sites, as well as to theatre and rock concerts and much more. Edinburgh is the historic capital of Scotland. It is a beautiful city (sometimes called the 'Athens of the North'), located in a splendid natural setting, and it is the political and cultural heart of Scotland.

Program advantages:

- Earn ISS and/or PLS credits; minimum of 7 credits - maximum of 12; up to 5 honors credits and an Independent Study option.
- Combine classroom study with field trips that allow you to meet and question public officials, Members of Parliament, British academics and journalists. Visit the Houses of Parliament, the British Museum, the Tower of London, the Churchill War Rooms, and Old Bailey. Attend first-run plays on London's West End as a group.
- Live in an English-speaking city where there is something to do every day during your free time: excellent theatre at reasonable prices; numerous galleries, museums, and historical landmarks, many of which are free; and much more.
- The academic schedule will allow for three long weekends for travel. There are trains to Scotland, Wales, and France. And London has convenient flights to all major European cities.
