## **Political Science Mentoring Conversation Guide (2025)**

**Overview**: Faculty and students should meet at the start of their working relationship (or about each semester) to set goals, boundaries, and expectations. This is a brief guide to having that conversation.

## **Conversation Topics**

<u>Contact</u>: How (in-person/online/text) and how often/long to meet? How should students/faculty make contact and what is the expected time for a response? Do you need an emergency contact option?

<u>Work</u>: What work is to be done, when must it be finished, how will it be turned in, and how much time should it take? Are these expectations doable and reasonable? Any accommodations needed?

Goals: What are faculty/student goals and how can the work at hand help achieve them?

<u>Styles</u>: Discuss preferences for working independently versus collaboratively, topics of interest, writing & work habits. How do you engage with positive/negative feedback? What are your relevant strengths or weaknesses? How do each of you view your role as student/faculty?
