Autocratic Regimes. Barbara Geddes, Joseph Wright, and **Erica Frantz**

Data for over 200 autocratic regimes in 122 countries from 1946-2010: regime start/failure dates and event narratives, failure event variables (level of violence/sub-sequent regime/mode of transition), and regime typology. Winner of the 2015 Lijphart/Przeworski/Verba Dataset Award, sponsored by the American Political Science Association section on Comparative Politics.

Autocratic Regime Features. Barbara Geddes, Joseph Wright, and **Erica Frantz**

Data coding time-varying features of autocratic regimes from 1946-2010 relating to the regime leader, the military, and the support party; includes estimates for a time-varying measure of personalism in dictatorships.
